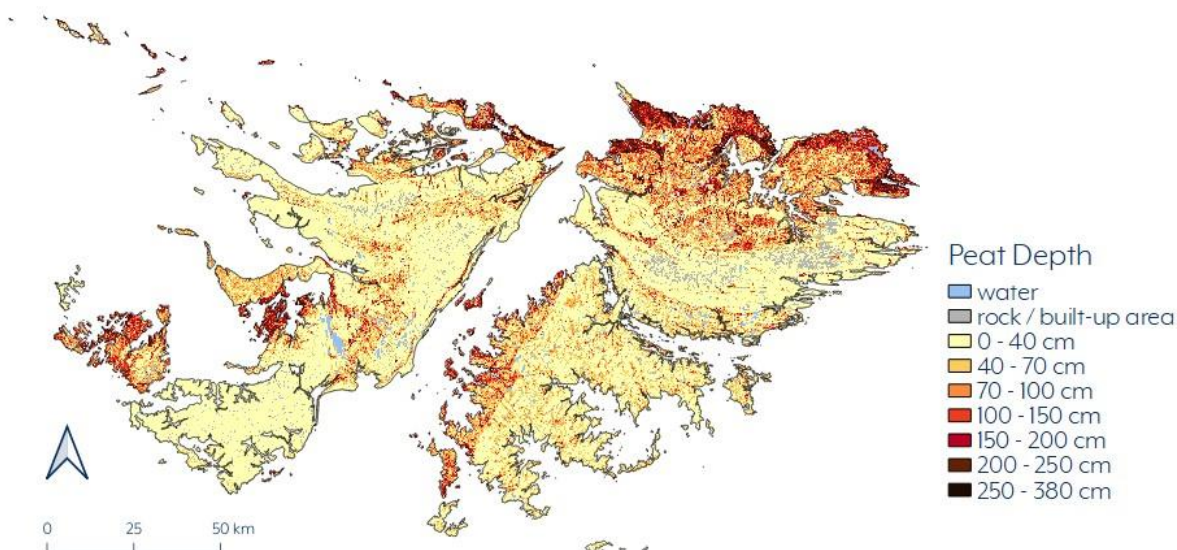


200 survey points & 1,000 soil profile descriptions

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After more than two years of project work, visits to 200 survey points, 1,000 soil profile descriptions, 2,400 individual soil tests in the lab and several soil model iterations, the majority of the soil maps are now completed!
